Congregational letter

October 2024

"Satisfy us in the morning with your unfailing love, that we may sing for joy and be glad all our days [...] establish the work of our hands for us – yes, establish the work of our hands."

- Psalm 90:14,17b

According the Psalm above, the normal human life span is 80 years "if we have the strength". Those years, we are told, are characterized by "trouble and sorrow", they "quickly pass", and then "we fly away" (v10).

Bethesda is celebrating her 80th "birthday" this month! So we would do well to remember two things: 1) a church's life span is NOT the same as a single human being's life span! and 2) the reason it isn't is because a church's life span is the aggregate of MANY human lives lived by faith and hope, together! In other words, a local church will stay alive and well as long as her people stay faithful, as long as the Holy Spirit is present within her present within the little bodies who are bound and committed to gather together as a bigger Body. Theoretically, a local church could go on forever – as long as there are Christians who are truly born again who are keen to meet under the same umbrella.

Whatever "troubles and sorrow" any of us may have experienced over the last 80 odd years, looking back I daresay most would affirm that they have indeed "passed quickly". And unless the Lord returns we as a church aren't "flying

away" anytime soon! Still, by any measure, they have been 80 "odd" years. Not just at Bethesda, of course, but everywhere. They have been years of rapid change. The things that we used to be able to count on have largely gone by the wayside. Thus, many of the needs we have in church ministry are different from what they were in the past. What people expect from their church is radically different.

The most rapid changes have been driven by technology. Just as one example: in 1944 when Bethesda started, PA systems were still relatively new. People were still getting used to amplification. And, it should go without saying, everyone assumed that going to church literally meant going to church, as in being physically present! Not so long ago scoring a "good seat" meant getting somewhere early to sit in the front row so that you could see and hear everything clearly. With amplification and large screens all that changed. The good seats became the seats near the back: "not standing out" became the new priority (and you still didn't have to miss anything!) Since COVID and the advent of Zoom and livestreaming, the "best seat in the

house" became literally that: the comfy recliner in your very own living room.

As I say, expectations have changed radically. Where once we were eager to get "up close and personal" we're now so frazzled with life that we'll do just what we need simply to "keep calm and carry on". That said, we still expect not to miss out on things! None of these observations are meant to point the finger, exactly, since they are true of pretty well everyone, myself included.

But the upshot of this is that for us to get up and get dressed and go to an event ... and at church, of all places ... well, it kind of feels like we are doing someone a favour. Which doesn't bode well. For any of us. Because, after all, we are not called to gather by just anyone, but by Someone. We're not doing him (or anyone else) a favour, Still, that Someone has compassion for us. He helps us and welcomes us despite our frailties. Not only that, he expects us to help one another, and to welcome one another, no matter where they are coming from or what their challenges are. We ALL struggle, and we ALL need encouragement!

This is why two ministry areas have become vital to modern ministry: Audio/Video (A/V) teams, which use technology to help modern people discover and pay attention to the Good News in an increasingly distracted and distracting world, and hospitality teams to help modern people like us "do" church: that is, to warmly welcome, lowkey care for, and kindly direct people who don't think they need it! Why "kindly direct"? We all have adopted a consumer mentality and forget sometimes what's expected of us - we all need
